Position Overview

The Assistant Golf Course Superintendent assists the Director of Grounds with the development and management of the golf course. The candidate should take special pride in delivering exceptional playing conditions for members and guests by providing extraordinary turf conditions. The Assistant Golf Course Superintendent will be responsible for managing multiple daily operations of the entire golf course.

The Assistant Superintendent will primarily be in charge of maintaining the integrity of the daily and long-range schedule as set forth by the Director of Grounds. He or she will supervise the maintenance and repair of motorized and other mechanical equipment working with a union staff, and does related work as required. The Assistant Superintendent may serve in the superintendent's capacity during his/her absence.

This position will report to the Director of Grounds.

Duties and Responsibilities

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING , BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

A. Assists in planning, scheduling, and supervising

1. Daily work schedules to be done the prior day
2. Daily log of work completed to be done at the end of each day
3. Irrigation log to be completed every morning
4. Direct supervision of all employees on the golf course staff

B. Agronomic monitoring of turfgrass

1. Daily review of all greens, tees, and fairways
2. Inform superintendent of turfgrass stress or unhealthy situations
3. Formulate ideas as to best recovery method using professional interpretation of the situation
4. Soil sampling in the spring and fall
5. Infiltration rate monitoring on a predetermined schedule

C. Irrigation System

1. Aid superintendent in daily scheduling of irrigation run times and areas to be watered
2. Daily review of turfgrass conditions as related to over/under watering
3. Fine-tuning of system to eliminate these undesirable conditions
4. Monitor pumpstation, booster pumps, and wells in the absence of the foreman

Education and Experience

- Two- or four-year degree/certificate in Agronomy {horticulture/plant/soil sciences needed}.
- Three years' experience supervising seasonal or full-time staff.
- Three years' experience in a country club.
- A desire to become a golf course superintendent.

- Participating knowledge of the game of golf.
- Working knowledge of the construction, establishment, and maintenance practices employed on golf course putting greens, tees, fairways, roughs, and bunkers; planting and culture of the turf grasses used on golf courses; planting, cultivating, and pruning of ornamental plants, shrubs, and trees; proper use of fertilizers and soil conditioners; pest control methods and materials; drainage methods; watering practices and automatic irrigation systems; and equipment operation, servicing, and minor repair.
- Ability to schedule and supervise work to achieve the most efficient utilization of employees and equipment.
- Ability to calibrate fertilizer/chemical application equipment.
- Ability to follow policies and procedures.
- Demonstrate good organizational and management skills.
- Ability to multi-task in a stressful environment.
